

Being United Methodist Pastoral Letters on the UMC - Our History -



This is my 4th letter in the "I Love the UMC!" Series. The 1st three were about our Articles of Religion. This letter begins the portion on history of the UMC, which you could say goes back all the way to June 28, 1703. This is the birthdate of **John Wesley**, one of the founders of the Methodist Movement.

John was 15th of 19 children born to Samuel and Susanna Wesley. Samuel was a rector in the Anglican Church. When John was 5 years old, a devastating fire broke out in their home. Though everyone else got out safely, John became trapped in an upstairs room. He called through an open window and neighbors stood on each other's shoulders to rescue him. He believed God saved him for a great purpose and called himself, "*a brand plucked from the fire.*"

John and his younger brother, Charles, were both educated at Oxford and became Anglican priests. These two brothers, along with a few others, were called "Methodists" behind their backs. It was because of the methodical way they met for Bible Study, prayer, communion and delivered food to those in prison. In those days, prisons did not provide food.

Their method of observing their Chrisitan faith attracted others, so John organized people into "classes" and then into smaller groups within the classes called "bands". This experience of small group meetings changed lives and grew exponentially. When colonists sailed to America, they brought their "Methodist" ways with them and started new classes and bands in the new world.

John never meant for this movement to become a denomination apart from the Anglican church. But when people pushed him to provide leadership in the new world, he reluctantly ordained other priests, though he wasn't a Bishop with the authority to do it.

It didn't matter. Methodist societies cropped up like weeds. The first conference of Methodist preachers in the colonies was held in Philadelphia in 1773. The ten who attended pledged allegiance to Wesley's leadership and a system of regular conferences was inaugurated.

We continue to meet at Annual Conferences. Not only pastors, but also lay member delegates from every church, attend to business & worship together. Your CUMC Lay Members to Annual Conference this year are Linda Faxon and Steve Dempster. We'll meet at the Burbank Marriott this year June 12 thru 15.
